The current system is obsolete and no longer provides the reliability or capacity needed to support a growing population and increasingly complex emergency response needs. This project will ensure clear, reliable, and real-time communication among first responders, which is critical during emergencies such as fires, natural disasters, and public safety incidents. I am requesting funding for the Northwest Calistoga Fuels Mitigation. The entity to receive funding for this project is Napa County located at 1195 Third Street, Napa CA, 94559.

The Northwest Calistoga Fuels Mitigation and Defensible Space Project is designed to reduce wildfire risk in a high-risk Wildland-Urban Interface area by combining landscape-scale fuel reduction with targeted residential mitigation. The project will establish 125 acres of targeted grazing and 7 miles of roadside fuel breaks to slow fire spread and improve evacuation safety, while also supporting defensible space and home hardening for at least 50 high-risk properties, prioritizing low-income and elderly residents.

The project is a good use of taxpayer funds because it focuses on proactive, cost-effective mitigation that reduces the likelihood and severity of future disasters. By lowering wildfire intensity and improving emergency response through real-time data integration into Tablet Command and Enhanced Resilience Site systems, the project helps protect lives, property, and critical infrastructure. These investments reduce long-term recovery costs, decrease reliance on federal disaster assistance, and strengthen local capacity to manage wildfire risk.

I am requesting funding for the Armfield Lemen Infrastructure Project. The entity to receive funding for this project is Yolo County Housing Authority located at 147 West Main Street Woodland, CA 95695.

The Armfield Lemen Infrastructure Project in Woodland, California will relocate and construct critical underground storm drainage, sewer, and water utility systems necessary to support a major neighborhood redevelopment effort. The project is essential to enable Tupelo, a 73-unit affordable housing development scheduled to break ground in early 2027. Tupelo represents the first phase of a broader transformation of the Armfield Lemen neighborhood, which will replace 132 units of severely distressed, 60–70-year-old public housing with over 300 new mixed-income units, along with a public park and community amenities. Existing utility systems are either outdated, improperly located within planned building footprints, or entirely absent. The storm drain runs through the middle of the site and must be relocated to the street. There is no sewer service for the first phase, requiring installation of new mains and connections. The water system dead-ends at the site and must be extended to provide adequate service and fire protection. This project will resolve all utility constraints in a single, coordinated effort by relocating the storm drain, installing a new sewer system, and extending the water main along the site perimeter. Completing this work upfront is the most efficient and cost-effective approach, avoiding repeated construction, additional mobilization costs, and disruption to future residents. This investment directly supports the creation of high-quality affordable housing for public housing residents, individuals with disabilities, and low-income households, while advancing long-term community revitalization.

The project is a good use of taxpayer funds because it unlocks significant leveraged investment and delivers long-term public benefits. The project directly supports the creation of affordable housing for low-income households, individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, and current public housing residents, while also enabling future phases that will expand housing opportunities further. It will generate construction jobs, reduce long-term infrastructure costs, and revitalize a distressed public housing site into a sustainable, mixed-income community. By

funding essential infrastructure that enables housing production, reduces inefficiencies, and leverages substantial non-federal investment, this project represents a strategic and cost-effective investment in community development, housing affordability, and economic growth.
